

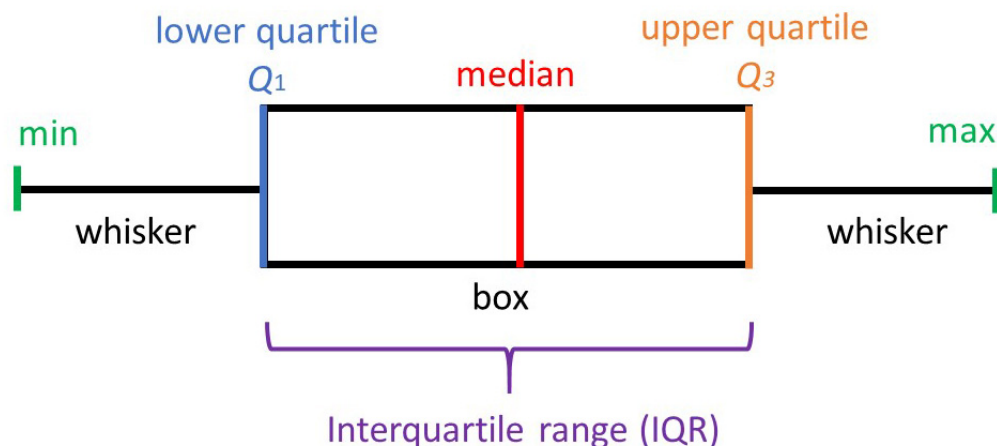
MATH 3

This week in math, we are working on gathering data for the Module 10 test. Students are counting how often they hear and say each of “please” and “thank you” and then will be creating a box and whisker plot with their data. The test is due June 10. While we will not be going over the probability unit together, my hope is that all students will have worked through those lessons on Moby Max. In class for the remainder of our time together, we will be reviewing key topics we have learned this year.



Other notes:

- Students are now required to have their cameras turned on during my class - this is a requirement coming from Dr. Morissette. There are a few students who are still refusing to do so.
